## May 27, 2014 BCC Summary

**Final Orders In Land Use Cases** 

- <u>CDRC Case # V 13-5400 Tod Amon Variance</u>, Tod Amon, Applicant, Requested A Variance of Article V, Section 8.1.3 (Legal Access) of the Land Development Code, to allow access for a driveway to a property consisting of 18.46 Acres. The property is located at 29 Puertecito Road, within the vicinity of Golden, Within Section 19, Township 12 North, Range 7 East, (Commission District 3). John Lovato, Case Manager (Approved 3-0).
- <u>CDRC Case # V 14-5020 Dennis & Lynne Comeau Variance</u>, Dennis And Lynne Comeau, Applicants, requested a Variance of Article VII, Section 3.41.C.C.I (No Build Areas) to allow 30% slope disturbance for an existing driveway to access buildable area on a 66.52 acre parcel. ### Public Hearings On Proposed Ordinances Ordinances

- Ordinance No. 2014-05, Amending Ordinance No. 2014-1 (an Ordinance establishing a Living Wage within Santa Fe County; specifying employers subject to The Living Wage; making findings as to the necessity of a Living Wage; establishing a prohibition on retaliation for reporting violations of the Living Wage; providing for remedies and penalties; specifying enforcement officers; providing the process to be employed upon complaints of violation; establishing severability; and providing an effective date), to modify the base wage for tipped employees. (Second Public Hearing) Ordinance was approved 4-1, commissioner Mayfield voting against. Base wage for tipped employees increased to \$3.20 (30% of the minimum Living Wage which is \$10.66) effective January, 2015.
- Ordinance No. 2014-06, An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 2012-7 (Amending Ordinance 2010-5 to extend the time during which permits will remain valid), to ensure that Residential Solid Waste Permits shall not expire until fully utilized. (Second Public Hearing) was approved 3-2 (Commissioners Holian and Stefanics voting against).

- Ordinance No. 2014-, An Ordinance approving the 2014 Economic Development Plan; repealing on a limited basis Ordinance No. 1996-07; providing for detailed rules to be applied to assistance of qualifying economic projects, including the qualifications of applicants, requiring an application, requiring a project participation agreement and specifying its contents; providing for limitations on the amount of assistance permitted pursuant to the local economic development act; and requiring a special fund for monies received or held for an Economic Development Project was tabled. Public Hearing will be June 10, 2014.
- Ordinance No. 2014-\_\_\_\_, An Ordinance establishing a twenty-six (26) Ton Weight Limit on Old Lamy Trail County Road 33 was tabled indefinitely.

# Santa Fe County DWI Program Announces Enhanced Drunk Driving Enforcement for June

June 10, 2014

(Santa Fe, NM)—It's not your imagination, you are seeing more police and sheriff's vehicle on the roads. Law enforcement in Santa Fe County is saturating the roads with extra officers and patrols to catch drunk and unsafe drivers.

These extra patrols and checkpoints are scheduled for the month of June. More officers on the streets mean more drunk drivers will be caught behind the wheel and end up behind jail cell bars. Sobriety checkpoints and drunk driving/traffic safety saturation patrols are scheduled throughout Santa Fe County.

"Summer is a notoriously tragic time for driving while intoxicated. Law enforcement in Santa Fe County will be out in full force with checkpoints and officers saturating the roads and highways arresting drunk drivers. I want to take this opportunity to remind everyone to Think Santa Fe, think about not driving after drinking, think about a Cab Ride Home, Think before you drink." said Lupe Sanchez, Santa Fe County DWI Coordinator.

Special funding through grant funds from the Santa Fe County DWI Program help the Santa Fe County Sheriff, Santa Fe Police, New Mexico State Police, Tesuque Tribal Police pay for overtime wages for officers to conduct extra patrols.

### Santa Fe County Firewise Green Waste Amnesty

**Santa Fe, NM** – Santa Fe County is offering a green waste amnesty as part of a Firewise initiative. The amnesty is valid until <u>June 30, 2014</u> at the Jacona, Stanley and Eldorado Transfer Stations. This offer is available to all Santa Fe County residential solid waste permit holders (you will need to show your pass, but it will not be punched, if your load is only green waste).

"The program will allow residents with dried out vegetation on their property to dispose of it free of charge and create a defendable space around their home, helping to reduce the risk of fire," said Santa Fe County Fire Chief, David Sperling.

Chief Sperling continued to explain that by conducting spring cleanup and maintaining the vegetation on your property you can greatly reduce the potential of fires in your community.

## Santa Fe County Imposes Firework Ban

**Santa Fe County – June 10, 2014** – The Santa Fe County Board of County Commissioners passed Resolution 2014-46 declaring extreme or severe drought conditions and banning the sale and use of certain fireworks in the unincorporated portions of Santa Fe County and within wildlands in the County.

Any types of fireworks that go up in the air such as rockets, aerial spinners, stick-type rockets and ground audible devices including fire crackers are banned from use or sale in Santa Fe County. All fireworks are banned within wild land areas. This includes areas that are covered with trees, grass and shrubs.

This resolution shall be effective for 30 days, but may be reissued if extreme or severe drought conditions continue.

## Santa Fe County would like to remind residents about the following:

### **Open Burn Restrictions**

An Emergency Ordinance Declaring Hazardous Fire Conditions and Imposing Restrictions on Open Fires, Smoking and other Ignition Sources has been approved by the Santa Fe County Board of County Commissioners.

### Ordinance 2014-3 prohibits:

- Open fires of any kind
- Open burning of vegetation or rubbish
- Littering on public roadways/areas with ignited smoking materials
- Campfires
- Smoking within a County park campground or any wild land area, except within an enclosed vehicle or in a building which is specifically authorized for such and is exempt from the New Mexico No Smoking in Public Facilities Act
- Use of off-road vehicles, motor bikes, or other motorized apparatus within county parks, campgrounds and wild land areas
- The issuance of licenses or permits for open burning of any kind

# Cerrillos Hills State Park




<u>Cerrillos Hills State Park</u> **Friday, June 13, 7pm** *Lucky Moon Hike*
