- » Unconscious or Unresponsive (no response to shouting or shaking)
- » Pale or Blue Lips, Face or Fingertips
- » Skin Cold to the Touch
- » Slow, Shallow, or Raspy Breathing/No Breathing
- » Gurgling or Snore-like Sounds
- » Pinpoint Pupils
