**ITEM AND ISSUE:** PUBLIC WORKS MONTHLY REPORT FOR APRIL 2013

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### DISCUSSION

#### Capital Project Delivery

We are currently managing 87 capital projects. Notable milestones in our successful execution of this program are listed below.

The new Courthouse is 99% complete and, after many years, can finally come off the active list. Other projects nearing completion include the new cooling tower in the Public Safety Complex, the Edgewood Open Space, and the Santa Fe River Trail San Isidro Park Channel Restoration.

The Nambe Community Center Phase II, the Rio Quemado River Restoration, and the La Cienega Fire Station 2 Renovation designs kicked off.

Numerous projects are finishing the design stage and/or moving into the construction stage. These include the Cundiyo Parking Lot, Improvements at the Quill Wastewater Treatment Plant, the South Meadows Open Space, County Road 98 Widening Phase II, Vista Grande Library, and the La Cienega Fire Station 1 Renovation.

Meanwhile, notable projects in progress include the Caja del Rio Road Repair (60% complete), the Edgewood Fire Station (45%), the Arroyo Alamo West drainage study (10%), the NE/SE Connector Location Study (20%), and the Old Santa Fe Trail Bike Lane/Water Line design (60%). The latter two projects have recently had public meetings as required by the state funding source.

Staff continues to search for a suitable site for the Highway 14 Senior Center, a process that has proven surprisingly complicated. An ideal site has been identified near the junction with CR 42, but the surrounding homeowners are resisting.

Grant funds were just received for the Oscar Huber Grandstand Renovation Phase II in Madrid, and the La Cienega Water Line Extension and La Cienega Spring Monitoring projects, both Water Trust Board recipients. The WTB loans are expected to close on June 7, 2013. The Oscar Huber Grandstands

Renovation project needs the original design updated to comply with new code requirements, which is in process now. We are finalizing the environmental assessment for the Glorieta water system project in preparation for issuing the IFB for construction.

Information on all active projects can be found in the attached Table 1: Capital Project Status Update.

We also submitted our "MS4" (stormwater management ) permit to the EPA this month, thus avoiding a potentially costly fine. The EPA will expand MS4 requirements and require a watershed-based approach starting in January 2014; it makes sense to partner with the City to meet these new requirements.

### **Operation and Maintenance**

Work order completion rates continue to be high, as seen at Table 2. April was an average month for the receipt of work orders in all categories, higher than February but slightly lower than January and March. Facility work completion remains our lowest for completion rates. This is mostly due to the large nature of the work orders, primarily in County-wide facilities. We are deploying tablet computers to the road maintenance districts, which should increase responsiveness to Cartegraph requests. If that concept works, we will look at doing something similar to other field crews.

We performed an emergency repair of Calle Debra in La Cienega. Beavers in the Santa Fe River undermined the road, and the road itself was very near imminent collapse. These beavers have been considered a problem for some time, but mostly for reasons of impairing river flows to downstream irrigators. Now, however, they are causing a safety hazard on County roads, raising the stakes. Solving the problem will require a coordinated effort from the County, the City, and the BLM.

We've commenced our annual road striping program. We stripe on average 60 miles of road per year.

The solid waste team hauled 819 tons to Caja del Rio Landfill in April, which is slightly below average.

We received numerous accolades from Santa Fe County constituents for our operation and maintenance activities, including a letter to the editor in the Santa Fe New Mexican and an email from a resident of La Barbara Road.

### **Utilities**

We have been working with the US Bureau of Reclamation to expand the scope of the Aamodt EIS to include the Chupadero/Rio en Medio area. This area was originally excluded from the larger service area back in 2006, but it was decided during the EIS kick-off process to include it back in. Also related to Aamodt, the engineer authorized by Resolution 2012-147 has been hired.

We met with the board of the Eldorado Water and Sanitation District and made a presentation sponsored by SERA/Green Cafe to the Eldorado community, both on the possibility of hooking Eldorado up to the County utility once the water line to Canoncito is completed. There seems to be increased interest in this direction compared to a year ago.

~~We were successful in gaining the State Penitentiary as a water customer, with a BDD water connection replaced three deep wells. This will be a significant revenue source for the County (estimated ) and will eliminate a large draw on the aquifer, thus helping the springs in La Cienega.~~

- ◆ They use cancer-causing pesticides.


Farmers are required to create an "organic" label if:
