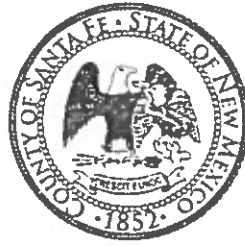

Update on Selected Capital Projects (Public Works/Mark Hogan)

1. Hwy 14 Senior/Community Center. This will be an update on the land acquisition process and next steps.
2. Torcido Loop Paving/Racetrack Subdivision Paving. These projects have issues with drainage and drainage easements across private property.
3. La Barbaria Road Paving. A phasing plan is being developed for this project.
4. Vista Aurora Lift Station. This project was funded by a state grant.
5. County Road 109. This project is facing a certain amount of community opposition.

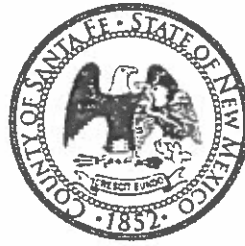

Subject: Dollars 4 Schools Program

Issue:

The Santa Fe Community Foundation and the Santa Fe County Youth Development Program (YDP) collaboratively work together to provide funding opportunities for services to the youth of YDP through the Dollars 4 Schools Program.

Background:

The Dollars 4 Schools program through the Santa Fe Community Foundation is committed to developing and bringing resources and valuable programming to the youth of Santa Fe. Currently YDP and the Santa Fe Community Foundation are working collaboratively to bring in educational programs to YDP.

Dollars 4 Schools has provided YDP with funding for programs such as ARTSmart, Anti-Bullying programs, and mentorship programs. More recently the Dollars 4 Schools initiative has brought screen actors to meet the youth at YDP, such as Quinton Aaron, Eric Martinez and Nora Chavez. These actors visited the youth at YDP and shared their personal stories of struggle and growth.

Through the Dollars 4 Schools initiative, the Spanish Colonial Art Society has brought in artists are currently working with the youth in the traditions of the Spanish Colonial Arts. This program provides the youth with materials and tools to complete various art projects. Many of the finished art projects through this program are currently being displayed at local art exhibits.

Staff Recommendations

The Public Safety Department recommends that Santa Fe County continue the collaboration with the Santa Fe Community Foundation to bring in programs at YDP.
