Annamarie Maes us under my care for recently diagnosed relapsing remitting multiple sclerosis. She has MRI evidence of 12 white matter lesions in her brain, a lumbar puncture showing 11 oligoclonal bands and an episode of weakness of acute onset that took 2 weeks to become ambulatory. She is an appropriate candidate for prophylactic therapy and Copaxone has been chosen as the medicine for her.

Since this is a clinic, you may be asked to wait up to two hours before your child can be seen. We will arrange for drinks and snacks for the children and the Ballut Abyad Shrine Clown Unit will be in attendance to help make the time pass more pleasantly for the patients. A Shriner will be assigned to each family to ease the clinic process.

If your child can be treated at the Screening/Outreach Clinic, they will be treated that same day. If it is determined that your child will benefit from in-patient treatment, a hospital appointment will be set. If an appointment is set at the hospital, please contact me by phone and I will make transportation arrangements for one parent/guardian and the patient.

It is extremely important that you keep this appointment since medical staff are flown in from the Los Angeles Shriners Hospital to see children in Albuquerque only twice a year. If a patient misses two appointments at this Albuquerque Outreach Clinic the child will be terminated from the Shriners Hospitals for Children treatment program. Parent/Guardian will be responsible for Food, Lodging and Transportation to the clinic.

To Whom It May Concern:

Gerard's House is a nonprofit grief support center for children and teenagers who have experienced the death of someone important in their lives. We provide free peer grief support groups and related services for bereaved youth and also for their parents and caregivers.

The Hernandez family—Annamarie, Luis, Juancarlos and Jonathan Hernandez—has been grieving the death of Annamarie's grandmother Ramona Romero. They have also been recovering from the trauma they experienced as a result of the car accident in which Ramona Romero died. Since their orientation at Gerard's House on June 13, 2011, we have been providing grief support services to the Hernandez family; Juancarlos continues to participate in one of our weekly grief support groups.

Juancarlos' emotional and behavioral distress since the traumatic accident have been very pronounced. His symptoms are consistent with PTSD combined with complicated grief. Because Juancarlos is intensely irritable and anxious, he is easily roused to both anger and fear, and Jonathan's ADD presents a constant challenge for him. After observing them together, I can see how important it is important for each child to have his own space as the family continues to grieve, heal and recover. In my opinion, Juancarlos and Jonathan would greatly benefit from having separate bedrooms during this time.

Fire Department Access

Shall comply with Article 9 - Fire Department Access and Water Supply of the 1997 Uniform Fire Code inclusive to all sub-sections and current standards, practice and rulings of the Santa Fe County Fire Marshal

Fire Access Lanes

Section 901.4.2 Fire Apparatus Access Roads. (1997 UFC) When required by the Chief, approved signs or other approved notices shall be provided and maintained for fire apparatus access roads to identify such roads and prohibit the obstruction thereof or both.

Roadways/Driveways

Shall comply with Article 9, Section 902 - Fire Department Access of the 1997 Uniform Fire Code inclusive to all sub-sections and current standards, practice and rulings of the Santa Fe County Fire Marshal.

Driveway plan meets the minimum County Standards for 20' wide driving surface from entry gate to the existing second home from there a 14' wide driving surface. A Hammerhead turnaround shall be installed per plans dated 08/02/2012. Roads shall meet the minimum County standards for fire apparatus access roads of a minimum all-weather driving surface and an unobstructed vertical clearance of 13' 6" within this type of proposed development.

Street Signs/Rural Address

Section 901.4.4 Premises Identification (1997 UFC) Approved numbers or addresses shall be provided for all new and existing buildings in such a position as to be plainly visible and legible from the street or road fronting the property.

Section 901.4.5 Street or Road Signs. (1997 UFC) When required by the Chief, streets and roads shall be identified with approved signs.

Slope/Road Grade

Section 902.2.2.6 Grade (1997 UFC) The gradient for a fire apparatus access road shall not exceed the maximum approved.

There are no slopes that exceed 11%.

Restricted Access/Gates/Security Systems

Section 902.4 Key Boxes. (1997 UFC) When access to or within a structure or an area is unduly difficult because of secured openings or where immediate access is necessary for life-saving or firefighting purposes, the chief is authorized to require a key box to be installed in an accessible location. The key box shall be of an approved type and shall contain keys to gain necessary access as required by the chief.

To prevent the possibility of emergency responders being locked out, all access gates should be operable by means of a key or key switch, which is keyed to the Santa Fe County Emergency Access System (Knox Rapid Entry System). Details and information are available through the Fire Prevention office.

Fire Protection Systems

Automatic Fire Protection/Suppression

This office highly recommends installation of an automatic fire suppression system as per 1997 Uniform Fire Code, Article 10 Section 1003.2.1 and the building Code as adopted by the State of New Mexico and/or County of Santa Fe. Required automatic fire suppression systems shall be in accordance with NFPA 13 and 13D Standard for automatic fire suppression system. It is recommended that the homeowner contact their insurance carrier to find their minimum requirements.

Fire Alarm/Notification Systems

Automatic Fire Protection Alarm systems are highly recommended as per 1997 Uniform Fire Code, Article 10 Section 1007.2.1.1 and the Building Code as adopted by the State of New Mexico and/or the County of Santa Fe. Required Fire Alarm systems shall be in accordance with NFPA 72, National Fire Alarm Code, for given type of structure and/or occupancy use.

Fire Extinguishers

Article 10, Section 1002.1 General (1997 UFC) Portable fire extinguishers shall be installed in occupancies and locations as set forth in this code and as required by the chief. Portable fire extinguishers shall be in accordance with UFC Standard 10-1.

Portable fire extinguishers are highly recommended to be installed in occupancies and locations as set forth in the 1997 Uniform Fire Code. Portable fire extinguishers shall be in accordance with UFC Standard 10-1.

Life Safety

Fire Protection requirements listed for this development have taken into consideration the hazard factors of potential occupancies as presented in the developer's proposed use list. Each and every individual structure of a private occupancy designation will be reviewed and must meet compliance with the Santa Fe County Fire Code (1997 Uniform Fire Code and applicable NFPA standards) and the 1997 NFPA 101, Life Safety Code, which have been adopted by the State of New Mexico and/or the County of Santa Fe.

General Requirements/Comments

Inspections/Acceptance Tests

Shall comply with Article 1, Section 103.3.2 - New Construction and Alterations of the 1997 Uniform Fire Code, inclusive to all sub-sections and current standards, practice and rulings of the Santa Fe County Fire Marshal.

The developer shall call for and submit to a final inspection by this office prior to the approval of the Certificate of Occupancy to ensure compliance to the requirements of the Santa Fe County Fire Code (1997 UFC and applicable NFPA standards) and the 1997 NFPA 101, Life Safety Code.
