BOND ELECTION RESOLUTION NO. 2000-115

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Santa Fe County, New Mexico, (the "Board") has heretofore adopted a resolution (the "Bond Election Resolution") calling for the following Bond Questions to be on the General Election ballot:

1. Shall the County of Santa Fe, New Mexico be authorized to issue its general obligation bonds, in one or more series, in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$4,500,000 for the purposes of acquiring real property, constructing, remodeling, and making additions to County buildings used for public safety purposes, including fire stations and necessary fire apparatus and including parking facilities and fire and law enforcement training facilities, and the acquisition of necessary telecommunications, computer hardware and integrated software systems, said bonds to be payable from general (ad valorem) taxes and to be issued and sold at such time or times, upon such terms and conditions as the Board of County Commissioners may determine and as permitted by law?
2. Shall the County of Santa Fe, New Mexico be authorized to issue its general obligation bonds, in one or more series, in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$4,000,000 for the purposes of acquiring real property and constructing and equipping county buildings for public works purposes, including road maintenance, solid waste and other public works purposes, said bonds to be payable from general (ad valorem) taxes and to be issued and sold at such time or times, upon such terms and conditions as the Board of County Commissioners may determine and as permitted by law?
3. Shall the County of Santa Fe, New Mexico be authorized to issue its general obligation bonds, in one or more series, in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$8,000,000 to acquire necessary real estate and easements for open space, open space trails, and related areas and facilities within the County to renew "The Wildlife, Mountains, Trails, and Historic Places Program" in order to preserve land in watersheds to protect clean water, to preserve natural and historical areas including mountains and foothills, sacred sites, land for wildlife and native plants, arroyos and river parkways, trails, agriculture and to provide neighborhood parks for families and children, which Program shall be subject to an annual audit and review by an independent citizen oversight committee, said bonds to be issued and sold as permitted by law?

4. Shall the County of Santa Fe, New Mexico be authorized to issue its general obligation bonds, in one or more series, in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$12,000,000 for the purposes of acquiring real property and remodeling and making additions to the County's judicial complex including parking facilities, said bonds to be payable from general (ad valorem) taxes and to be issued and sold at such time or times, upon such terms and conditions as the Board of County Commissioners may determine and as permitted by law?

WHEREAS, the Bond Election Resolution was duly adopted and is in accordance with law.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Santa Fe County, New Mexico, as follows:

**Section 1:** That the Bond Questions called for by the Bond Election Resolution shall appear on the ballot of the election to be held in Santa Fe County, New Mexico, on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2000 (the "Election Date") which is the same date as the statewide general election.

**Section 2:** The Bond Questions shall be published in full in substantially the following form as provided by law, in English and Spanish, and the County Clerk shall obtain an affidavit of said publications thereof and shall file the same with the minutes of this meeting:

**NOTICE OF SANTA FE COUNTY GENERAL OBLIGATION  
BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 7, 2000**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at the General Election which will be held in the County of Santa Fe, New Mexico (the "County") on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2000, there will be presented for vote to the qualified registered electors of the County the following Bond Questions:

1. Shall the County of Santa Fe, New Mexico be authorized to issue its general obligation bonds, in one or more series, in an aggregate

1 principal amount not exceeding \$4,500,000 for the purposes of  
2 acquiring real property, constructing, remodeling, and making  
3 additions to County buildings used for public safety purposes,  
4 including fire stations and necessary fire apparatus and including  
5 parking facilities and fire and law enforcement training facilities,  
6 and the acquisition of necessary telecommunications, computer  
7 hardware and integrated software systems, said bonds to be  
8 payable from general (ad valorem) taxes and to be issued and sold  
9 at such time or times, upon such terms and conditions as the Board  
10 of County Commissioners may determine and as permitted by law?

12 2. Shall the County of Santa Fe, New Mexico be authorized to issue  
13 its general obligation bonds, in one or more series, in an aggregate  
14 principal amount not exceeding \$4,000,000 for the purposes of  
15 acquiring real property and constructing and equipping county

17 solid waste and other public works purposes, said bonds to be  
18 payable from general (ad valorem) taxes and to be issued and sold  
19 at such time or times, upon such terms and conditions as the Board  
20 of County Commissioners may determine and as permitted by law?

22 3. Shall the County of Santa Fe, New Mexico be authorized to issue  
23 its general obligation bonds, in one or more series, in an aggregate  
24 principal amount not exceeding \$8,000,000 to acquire necessary  
25 real estate and easements for open space, open space trails, and  
26 related areas and facilities within the County to renew "The  
27 Wildlife, Mountains, Trails, and Historic Places Program" in order  
28 to preserve land in watersheds to protect clean water, to preserve  
29 natural and historical areas including mountains and foothills,  
30 sacred sites, land for wildlife and native plants, arroyos and river  
31 parkways, trails, agriculture and to provide neighborhood parks for  
32 families and children, which Program shall be subject to an annual  
33 audit and review by an independent citizen oversight committee,  
34 said bonds to be issued and sold as permitted by law?

36 4. Shall the County of Santa Fe, New Mexico be authorized to issue  
37 its general obligation bonds, in one or more series, in an aggregate  
38 principal amount not exceeding \$12,000,000 for the purposes of  
39 acquiring real property and remodeling and making additions to  
40 the County's judicial complex including parking facilities, said  
41 bonds to be payable from general (ad valorem) taxes and to be  
42 issued and sold at such time or times, upon such terms and  
43 conditions as the Board of County Commissioners may determine  
44 and as permitted by law?

1 No ballot shall be received unless, on the date of the election, the person offering to vote  
2 is a registered, qualified elector of the County. The voter registration books of the County shall  
3 be closed by the County Clerk at 5:00 p.m. on October 10, 2000. Any person otherwise eligible  
4 to vote as a qualified elector and not currently registered may register prior to such time at the  
5 Office of the County Clerk, 102 Grant Avenue, Santa Fe, New Mexico or at the office of any  
6 National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) agency.

7 All registered, qualified electors in Santa Fe County, New Mexico, shall be entitled to  
8 vote; absentee voting shall be permitted as authorized by the Absent Voter Act, Section 1-6-1, *et*  
9 *seq.*, NMSA 1978, as amended. Absentee early voting shall be permitted as authorized by the  
10 Absentee-Early Voting Act, Section 1-6A-1 *et seq.*, NMSA 1978, as amended. Applications for  
11 absentee ballots may be obtained from the Office of the County Clerk, 102 Grant Avenue, Santa  
12 Fe, New Mexico. Office of the County Clerk must be in receipt of applications for absentee  
13 ballots by 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 2, 2000. The County Clerk is required by statute to  
14 destroy unused absentee ballots by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, November 6, 2000. The County Clerk  
15 shall accept completed official absentee ballots until 7:00 p.m. on November 7, 2000.

16 Any person wishing to vote absentee in-person may do so at the Office of the County  
17 Clerk, 102 Grant Avenue, Santa Fe, New Mexico, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through  
18 Friday, September 28, 2000 through November 3, 2000 and from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on  
19 Saturday, November 4, 2000. Any person wishing to vote absentee early may do so at the Office  
20 of the County Clerk, 102 Grant Avenue, Santa Fe, New Mexico, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.,  
21 Monday through Friday, October 18, 2000 to November 2, 2000 or from 12:00 noon to 7:00  
22 p.m., Monday through Sunday, October 18, 2000 to November 1, 2000; and on Thursday,  
23 November 2, 2000 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., at the Santa Fe County Fair Building on Rodeo  
24 Road, Santa Fe, New Mexico.

25 The polls, except the absentee and early voter precincts set forth above, for the Election  
26 will be open between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on November 7, 2000. The polls shall  
27 be located within the County as set forth in Exhibit A hereto:

 38 **Section 3:** The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Board and County Clerk be, and they  
 39 hereby are, authorized and directed to take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the  
 40 provisions of this Resolution and the Bond Election Resolution, including the giving of notice  
 41 pursuant to Section 6-15-1, NMSA 1978, to the Local Government Division of the Department  
 42 of Finance and Administration and are directed to attach a copy of the notice and the reply  
 43 thereto to the minutes of this meeting.

1           **Section 4:** The County Clerk is authorized and directed to take any and all steps  
2 necessary for the proper conduct of the election, including giving timely notice of the election by  
3 proclamation by publication and posting thereof and compliance with the Federal Voting Rights  
4 Act.

5           **Section 5:** All action heretofore taken by the Board, the Chairman or Vice Chairman of  
6 the Board and the County Clerk not inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution and the  
7 Bond Election Resolution be, and the same hereby are, ratified, approved and confirmed.

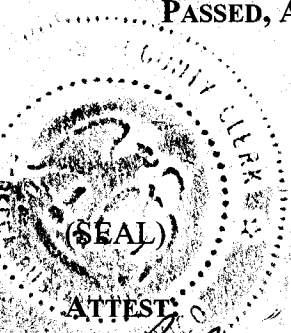

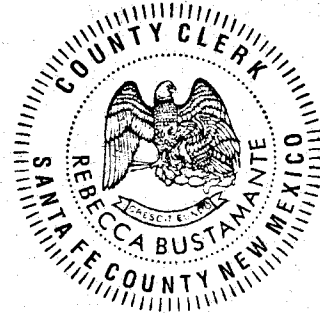
