### County Approves Road Settlement Agreements

The Santa Fe County Commission unanimously approved four separate settlement agreements with the Pueblos of Nambé, Pojoaque, San Ildefonso and Tesuque on Tuesday, January 30, 2018

The settlements with four Northern New Mexico Pueblos establish rights of way for certain roadways for the next 198 years, two successive 99-year terms.

"I believe the settlement agreements are a reasonable compromise for all parties, which bring fair and responsible resolution to a decades-long issue," said County Manager, Katherine Miller. She continued, "This is a notable accomplishment between all parties involved." Tribal and county leaders applauded the agreements.
