**June 9 & June 16, 2006**

This special canvassing meeting of the Santa Fe Board of County Commissioners was called to order at approximately 3:30 p.m. by Chairman Harry Montoya, in the Santa Fe County Commission Chambers, Santa Fe, New Mexico.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance and State Pledge, roll was called by County Clerk Valerie Espinoza and indicated the presence of a quorum as follows:

**II. Opening of Canvassing**

DENISE LAMB (Bureau of Elections Chief Director): Mr. Chairman, Commissioners, one of the important statutory duties that you all have as County Commissioners is that you sit as the canvassing board of the County. The purpose of this meeting is to all the County Clerk, who is your *ex officio* secretary under state law for the purposes of canvassing elections to begin the canvass of the primary election of June 6<sup>th</sup>. What we need is for you to make a motion to direct us to proceed with the canvass of the election and then when that canvass is completed next Friday we will bring it back and have it completed for you to sign off on, after which point we will forward it to the state.

COMMISSIONER ANAYA: Mr. Chairman.

CHAIRMAN MONTOYA: Commissioner Anaya.

COMMISSIONER ANAYA: I move that we direct our County Clerk, Valerie Espinoza, and her staff to begin the canvassing of Santa Fe County.

COMMISSIONER VIGIL: Second.

CHAIRMAN MONTOYA: Motion, second. Any other discussion?

**The motion to allow the canvassing to begin passed by unanimous [3-0] voice vote.**

CHAIRMAN MONTOYA: Motion carries three-zero. We will recess until June 16, 2006.

[The Commission recessed at 3:35 and reconvened at 4:00, June 16, 2006 with the same Commissioners in attendance.]

**III. Closing of Canvassing** *[Exhibit 1: Election Results Reporting Application]*

**CHAIRMAN MONTOYA:** Now this is the closing of canvassing. Madam Clerk.

**VALERIE ESPINOZA (County Clerk):** Commissioners, as I present for you the approval of the primary election canvas I would like to briefly acknowledge those people who made our success possible. First, the staff of my office which put in extended hours in the administration of this election. Complex statutes and timelines govern the administration of any election, including the filing of candidates' legal notices, ballot definitions, programming, deployment of nearly 200 voting systems and the training of 800 precinct board members. The dedication and professionalism of my staff is a credit to the County. I'd also like to thank Hutch Miller for his work in providing election information to the county's native people, and we have to thank Denise Lamb for directing the orchestra.

Second, I would like to acknowledge the dedication of our precinct boards. We conducted seven classes around the county and I would like to report that 94 percent of our presiding judges attended. I hope to improve this to 100 percent for the general election in November.

Third, let me thank the County's Information Technology staff, in particular Gavin, Chad and Eppie. In addition to keeping us up and running in the office they provided us with the necessary technology for five remote early voting sites and election night reporting support. This is the first time ever we have had an early polling site in the north as well.

I'd also like to thank the County Attorney's office for its timely and thorough legal assistance when we called on them, the Sheriff's Department for providing assistance on election day and traffic control on election night, and the Fire Department for providing early voting site polling places.

Here at the courthouse, Ish helped us with the weekend building access and parking issues. The success of this election was truly a collaborative effort requiring the teamwork of many and finally, I would like to thank each and every one of you for your support and encouragement in making this a success as well. Thank you.

**CHAIRMAN MONTOYA:** Commissioner Anaya.

**COMMISSIONER ANAYA:** Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I would also like to thank you, Madam Clerk, and all of your staff, Denise, and everybody that worked so hard, and the poll workers. If it wasn't for you all and the poll workers it wouldn't have been as successful as it was. So thank you very much.

**MS. ESPINOZA:** Thank you.

**CHAIRMAN MONTOYA:** Commissioner Vigil.

**COMMISSIONER VIGIL:** I agree.

CHAIRMAN MONTOYA: I too would like to extend congratulations for I think a rather uneventful election, which is always good. So we need to – Denise.

MS. LAMB: We would like, if it pleases you, to have a motion to approve the canvas of the primary election results from Santa Fe County, and then we need each of you to sign each of those copies that we gave you. And then in addition to that I have the certificates of nomination that will be mailed out in a couple of weeks to the winners of the elections and I need your signatures on those as well. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN MONTOYA: Okay. Commissioner Anaya.

COMMISSIONER ANAYA: Mr. Chairman, I move that we approve the canvassing results of the primary election in 2006 for Santa Fe County.

COMMISSIONER VIGIL: Second.

CHAIRMAN MONTOYA: There's a motion and a second. Further discussion?

**The motion to approve the canvassing results of the primary election passed by unanimous [3-0] voice vote.**

CHAIRMAN MONTOYA: I think we can adjourn and just sign these then.

COMMISSIONER ANAYA: Mr. Chairman.

CHAIRMAN MONTOYA: Commissioner.

COMMISSIONER ANAYA: Can we bring up another item?

CHAIRMAN MONTOYA: On the canvassing?

COMMISSIONER ANAYA: No. It would be different. Probably not.

CHAIRMAN MONTOYA: No. We would need to have it published.

COMMISSIONER ANAYA: Okay.

COMMISSIONER VIGIL: Mr. Chairman.

CHAIRMAN MONTOYA: Commissioner Vigil.

COMMISSIONER VIGIL: I have heard so many wonderful things about you, Denise and I just want to take a little bit of an opportunity to recognize you, not only from the staff you support here but from the entire state. Your reputation is phenomenal and I feel that Santa Fe County is so valued to have you working for us in addition to all the other staffers at the Clerk's office. One of these days I'd like to make arrangements with you to go to the warehouse and sort of get a hands-on feeling for what's going on, because my sense is we as Commissioners start making policy and don't always recognize the hands-on that goes on. I'm just so proud that you're with us and I want to thank you. And I do this on behalf and sort of vicariously through Valerie. She speaks so highly of you. Thank you for all the work you do.

MS. LAMB: I'd like to thank you also. It's a pleasure to be back at Santa Fe County, which was one of my original homes, but I cannot emphasize enough that both at the state and especially here at the County, I could not do any of this without the staff. The staff at the County Clerk's office has over 120 years experience between them. It's one of the most professional, experienced election staffs in the state, and I know that from my overseeing of 33 counties when I was at the state. And so while I appreciate very, very much your confidence in

me, I cannot overlook the fact that it would be impossible for me to do the job that I do for you if I did not have the people that I have working for me.

COMMISSIONER VIGIL: Thank you.

CHAIRMAN MONTOYA: Thank you, Denise.


COMMISSIONER VIGIL: And thank you, Eric. I want to recognize you.



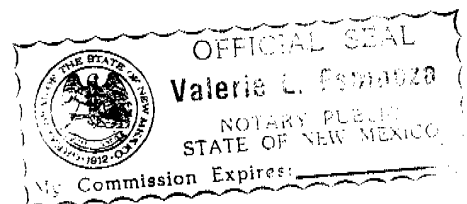

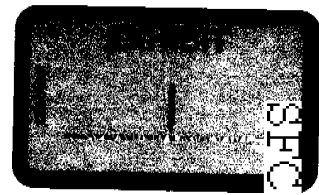
